Emergency policy statement

We are committed to keeping children safe and ensuring they know what to do in an emergency.

Emergency procedures

Some of the ways children are kept safe in the setting include:

Parents are asked for emergency contact information.

All children are involved in regular fire practices.

Children are taught to follow adult instructions if there is an emergency while they are on an outing.

I follow latest advice on safety from the fire service – to exit the premises with the children and call 999 to request the attendance of the fire service and ambulance if required.

In the event of an emergency, I will make every effort to contact parents, or the child's emergency contacts, and ask for the child to be collected as quickly as possible.

Emergencies will be recorded and Ofsted / the insurance company will be informed as necessary.



Fire detection and control: the following fire protection equipment is available and maintained –

There is a fire blanket on the wall in the kitchen.

There is a carbon monoxide detector in the kitchen.

There are smoke detectors on all floors of the setting.

Fire exits: exits are kept clear of clutter and keys to outside doors are kept in safe places and are accessible to adults.
